The third day of the special camp was focused on the physical fitness of an individual. For this Yoga session was planned for maintaining a sound and healthy life. Our target individuals were the students of Surjyodai High School students of class 6 to 8 from ME section. More than 100 students participated in the Yoga session. The invited Yoga Teacher Mr. Vicky Das, lecturer from Silapathar Science Senior Secondary school demonstrated some postures and exercises which are very helpful to maintain a good and healthy life. The students also actively participated in the programme. Just after the programme the volunteers and students actively participated in the sports activity and female volunteers interacted with the female students of the school and discussed the study methodology and how to prepare for examination.

The female volunteers also actively participated in the handloom weaving technique to inherit such skills. The volunteers also prepared their own food under the guidance of Mr. Nihar Jyoti Lahon, coordinator UBA.

















DAY -4 (Talent Hunt, Art and Quiz Competition)



DAY 5 (Health Camp, Celebrating World Health Day)

Silapathar Science College NSS unit and Unnat Bharat Abhiyaan undertook a survey at amalgamated Surjyodai High School under adopted village Sili Asomiya Gaon regarding calculation of BMI index of each student. The volunteers udertook thorough survey right from Class I to X, calculated the height and weight of each student and calculated the BMI index. The useful data has been prepared in Excel format and can be used to study the underweight, overweight and Malnutrition as well as fats level of the individual student. After the survey, UBA coordinator, Mr. Nihar Jyoti Lahon undertook a sensitization campaign containing various ingredients including basic amenities, organic farming, artisans and industrial livelihood, water management and sustainable energy. Just after the end of the programme, the last day schedule was discussed which would be a massive plantation programme of Segun(Teak) tree saplings plantation(of 70 nos.) and a cultural session in the evening.











DAY 7 (Plantation Programme and Cultural Competition)

The final day of the Silapathar Science College special camp mainly emphasized on massive plantation programme around the adopted village including holy place Naamghar and Surjyodai High School. Around 70 saplings planted during the occasion which was assisted by the Headmaster of the School Mr. Ramesh Sonowal and other subordinate teachers. Just after the plantation programme the Unit headed towards the concluding session of the 7days special camp, the cultural session. In a brief formal session, the Programme Officer, explained the aims and objectives of the special camp. After the formal speech, the various cultural events took place.
