**Date:** 02-04-2024

Silapathar Science College situated at Silapathar in the Dhemaji district of Assam organised the 'Bharatar Amritkal Joibo Boichitra Sanrakshan Chetana aru Vidyarthi Jagaran Yatra'. Nature's Beckon's ongoing students's program for awareness and sensitisation on biodiversity conservation among the college and university students across different districts of Assam. The Silapathar Sciencee College has been associated with Nature's Beckon's conservation initiatives from earlier time; this program further strengthens the ties in commitment to bolster the biodiversity conservation movement of Assam.

Dr. Ranjit Saikia, Principal - Silapathar Science College, Dr. Jitu Gogoi, Dr. Chandana Shyam, Dr. Pabitra Sharma, Dr. Partha Nath Dutta - IQAC Coordinator, from the college along with Sri. Soumyadeep Datta, Director - Nature's Beckon, Sri. Jugal Handique, Dhemaji Coordinator - Nature's Beckon graced the program. The eco club of Silapathar Science College welcomed Sri Soumyadeep Datta and Sri. Jugal Handique with warm felicitation on behalf of the College.

Saikia welcomed everyone to the program with his inaugural address. He spoke about the importance of biodiversity conservation and appreciated the work of Nature's Beckon in leading the biodiversity conservation movement of Assam. He drew everyone's attention to the urgent need to protect the Poba Reserve Forest without further delay. He mentioned about Nature's Beckon's long standing appeal to upgrade the status of Poba RF to Wildlife Sanctuary to ensure it's long term permanent protection in the future. It is worth mentioning that Dr. Ranjit Saikia has enriched the Poba conservation movement with his valuable research work on the Poba forest. The beautiful greenery of the Silapathar Science College, its lush plantation and the excellent college orchidarium clearly reflect the sincere commitment of the entire college team under the guidance of the respected Principal, Dr. Ranjit Saikia.

Sri. Soumyadeep Datta spoke at length on the importance of habitat preservation for conservation of flora & fauna and rich biodiversity of our region in long run. Wildlife research without any measures for habitat preservation is meaningless because our planet is reeling under mass species extinction due to habitat loss and destruction of primary forests across the world. Mere research is incapable of saving these forests. We must combine research work with correct conservation action, and habitat preservation is the most important conservation action at this time. The permanent protection of natural forests, wetlands, and natural ecosystems is most important for biodiversity conservation in the present time. He spoke about the significance of Assam's protected area movement in the successful conservation of countless species of wildlife, including many endangered species of non-human primates, mammals, birds, etc in Assam.

Sri. Datta spoke about the importance of the 'Ahum Basudhame Krit Mangaljanak' student's program in implanting a mind movement amongst the students of Assam, for their mental empowerment. He encouraged the students to seek the path of progress through selfless individual contributions to the community. He stressed upon the need of individual commitment amongst our college and university students to work voluntarily in spreading the light of education among the students, youth, and people in our country who lack equal

opportunities in their life's. Students must be the role models of positive, compassionate movements in our society instead of representing the pseudo and counterproductive illusions created and driven by certain sections of the society. Sri. Datta encouraged the students to connect with the rich heritage of India's traditional knowledge and wisdom, and to work as the harbingers of social change for the country. He stressed upon the need to embrace the responsibility of leading the Nation to the pinnacle of progress, development, and happiness by our youth in the coming days. Sri. Datta participated in a lively interactive session with the students that followed his speech.

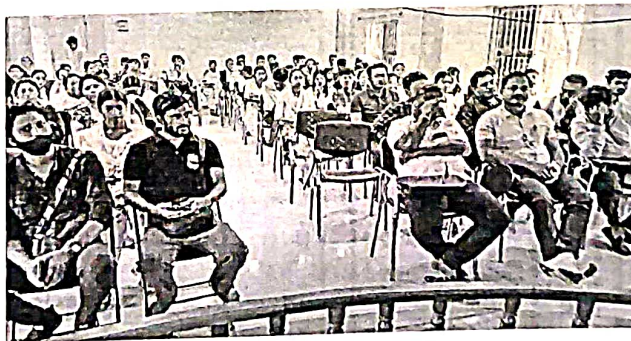




