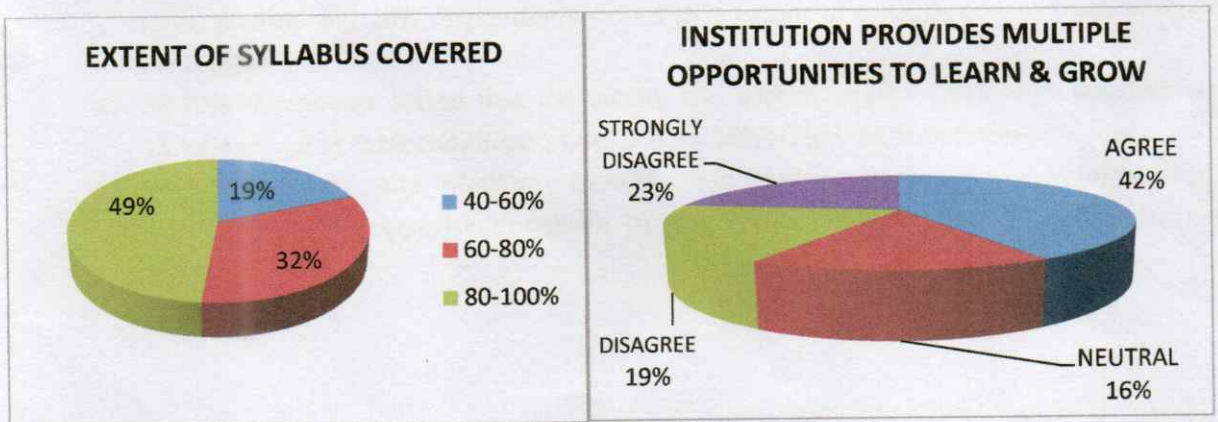

- 41.93% of the respondents rated the quality of teaching as Excellent, while 35.48% as Very Good and 22.58% as Good.
- 6.45% respondents stated that the availability of study materials in the college library is Excellent, while 38.70% considers as Very Good and still 48.38% and 6.45% considers as Good and Satisfactory respectively.



3. 6.45% respondents felt that the satisfaction level with the laboratory infrastructure is Excellent, while 80.64% felt Satisfactory, and 12.91% respondents felt Poor.
4. With regard to the facilities provided by the institution 6.45% respondents felt Extremely Satisfied while 29.03% were Very Satisfied and 54.83% respondents felt Satisfied and 9.67% were Neutral.
5. 29.03% respondents stated the safety of the college premises to be Very Satisfied, while 58.06% stated as Satisfactory and 12.90% were Neutral.
6. 41.93% Agreed that the college provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow while 16.12% were Neutral and 41.93% Disagreed (Ref. Pie Diagram).
7. 3.22% Strongly Agreed to the fact that the library has internet facility, computerized cataloguing with subscription to open access journals, while 87.09% Agreed and 9.67% Somewhat Agreed.
8. 54.83% students Agreed that the college provides financial support in terms of various scholarships/free-ships schemes to needy students from weaker background, while 29.03% were Neutral and 16.12% Disagreed.
9. 90.32% stated 'Yes' that the teachers were available during college working hours while 9.67% said 'No'.
10. 74.19% students said 'Yes' to have approached to teachers for Career Guidance and Assistance while 25.80% respondents said 'No'.
11. 90.32% students responded 'Yes' and 6.45% said 'No', and still 3.22% stated 'Can't Say' to the fact that teachers provide them with additional study materials/notes/books for clarifications and understanding of the subject.
12. 80.35% respondents stated 'yes' and 19.35% respondents rated 'No' to the fact that it was easy to obtain necessary resources from the college library.
13. With respect to separate common rooms for boys and girls 80.35 responded 'Yes' and 19.35% responded 'No'.
14. Given a chance to pursue another course in the college 41.35% responded 'Yes' , 32.25% 'Probably Yes', 16.12% stated 'can't Say and 9.67 responded 'Probaby No'.
15. 32.25% respondents stated 'Yes and 64.51% stated 'Probaby Yes' to think the college takes enough measures to curb racial and ethnic bias. 3.22% respondents rated 'Can'tSay'.
16. 49% repondents stated that the extent of syllabus covered was 80-100%, while 32% stated rated 60-80% and 19% respondents stated that extent of syllabus covered was 40-60(Ref. Pie Diagram).
17. 38.70% repondents stated that the faculty and support staff were Very Supportive while 16.12% stated as Extremely Supportive, and 45.16% stated as 'Supportive'.
18. 83.87% students rated 'Medium', 12.90% rated 'Highly' and 3.22% respondents rated as 'Low' against the opportunities given to students to take part in different co-curricular aspects.

  
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
